INDEPENDENT RESEARCH PROJECTS

Spanish Studies Abroad offers students a unique opportunity to investigate topics of personal and academic interest for credit while on our semester and academic year programs in Spain and Argentina. By pursuing an Independent Research Project (IRP), you can personalize your program with studies designed specifically to meet your needs and the requirements of your home college or university. In past semesters, students have undertaken IRP's in the fields of music, the humanities, visual arts, theatre, dance, and business, among others.

One student, for example, completed an IRP focusing on the works of celebrated Spanish poet and dramatist Federico García Lorca. She combined independent reading and research with acting classes and even worked on a production of García Lorca's 1936 play *La casa de Bernarda Alba*. Another studied the social, cultural and political implications of graffiti art on the streets of Seville and did as a final project an interactive visual presentation that engaged other students, staff and professors in a memorable and creative evening! Several students have taken private classes and combined them with an IRP for credit in various other academic disciplines.

If you wish to pursue an IRP, you must submit an Independent Research Project Proposal Form at least two months prior to the start of your program overseas. The form asks for a description of the IRP, methods of evaluation of your work while abroad, and the signature of the approving faculty member or dean of your home college or university. In some cases, work is evaluated on-site in Spain or Argentina and a grade assigned on the Spanish Studies Abroad transcript; in other cases, you may be required to submit your work to your home academic advisor for evaluation and award of grade and/or credit.

As a student with an approved Independent Research Project, you receive tutorial support from a member of our faculty or administration through regular meetings and discussions during the course of the semester. This tutor monitors your progress and serves as a resource while your investigation progresses.

The Spanish Studies Abroad Independent Research Project option provides you with almost limitless possibilities for specialized study while in Spain or Argentina. If you wish to discuss this program and your ideas further, please contact the Spanish Studies office in Amherst, Massachusetts.
